

Food, Farming and Habitats at Stockbridge

- Learn and grow (Stockbridge Schools project)** – series of 4 visits per year (mid March, late May, early July, mid Sept).

Four ½ day visits growing a wide range of vegetable and salad crops on their own allotment at Stockbridge. They will also look at crops growing in glasshouses. At the end of each visit they each take home a bag of produce which they have picked plus plants.

- Learn and grow (Stockbridge Schools project)** – as above but a series of 3 visits per year (late May, early July, mid Sept).

- BIG Harvest** – single 2-2.5 hour visit (late June/early July or late September)

This will allow pupils to learn about growing food crops and see field and glasshouse crops. They will harvest a bag of vegetables and salads to take home. We hope this will fit in with Healthy Eating and growing projects you may have planned at school for the summer or autumn terms.

- Food Live** – single visit in late June or early July

An event where children will harvest vegetable and salad crops and participate in cooking and food preparation using the fresh produce. All with a healthy eating theme.

- Conservation, habitats and biodiversity walk**

A ½ day visit which will involve a walk around the farm looking at wildlife in ditches, woodland, hedgerows and field margins. It will involve an interactive worksheet and quiz, looking at mini beasts, insects under microscopes and making a nesting box (extra charge).

This activity can be combined with **Big Harvest** to make a full day visit in late June/early July or mid/late September.

Typical charges are £2-4 per pupil depending on the length of visit and size of group. Transport can be organised by STC using a local coach company.
